BDM Law and Justice Group mala leaders work together to make sure that the Balanda legal system recognises Yolŋu Rom

The maŋal', woomera, is a peace symbol. It is what our old people used. They pointed it towards people fighting. They held it up, saying "stop there and go in peace". It meant that people were brought back together as a family. With the maŋal', everyone becomes one family again, sitting together, sharing together.



The bathi, dilly bag, is the place where we put all the information and the stories, and bring them safely to the community.

The gara, spear, represents the man going out hunting for fish. The spear is bringing the mari djämamirr back to the community.
